We had never done anything like Her research has paid before," Ms. Higbie said. "Bob Gramley, Business Advisor at the SBDC. was very encouraging during such a scary


change in our lives. He provided a wealth of information in writing a business plan, financial projections and overall advice on how to start and succeed in a new business."
